3. Orientation Meeting

The Orientation Meeting for each discipline will be held at the Centennial Hall according to the above schedule.

Important information concerning the detailed organisation of The World Games (running of the competitions, award ceremonies) will be given by the WOC and the FIG TC President of the respective discipline(s).

Participation is **compulsory** as per Technical Regulations, Section 1, Reg. 5.12. Unjustified failure to attend this meeting will result in a sanction of CHF 1'000.- against the Federation to be paid to the FIG.

Delegation representatives have to attend this meeting with a maximum of 2 accredited members per delegation, including the Head of Delegation or a substitute.

Judges may not represent their country at the Orientation Meeting (*but can be present in the meeting*).

4. Draw of lots for the starting order

The draw of lots for the starting orders has taken place in Lausanne, in FIG office, on 02 June 2017 in the presence of the FIG President Morinari Watanabe and FIG Secretary General André Gueisbuhler. The start lists are posted on the FIG website.

5. Change to the start list

If gymnasts get injured or ill before the arrival at the place of the competition (between the Nominative Registration and Accreditation), the injured or sick gymnasts can be replaced by another gymnast (and accredited) upon arrival provided that the name of the replaced gymnast was included in the Long List. An up-dated nominative list has to be given to the organizing committee and a copy to the FIG upon arrival.

In the case of injuries or illness between the time of accreditation and until 24 hours prior to the beginning of Qualifications, the NF is allowed to change accreditations. The gymnast injured or ill must return his accreditation and another gymnast can be accredited (provided that the name of the replaced gymnast was included in the Long List)

All changes to the Start List must be approved by FIG.

6. Scoring system / results

Scores and results of a competition will be displayed on the electric score board by Swiss Timing (TISSOT). Results will be delivered to each delegation at the end of each day of competition.

7. Music (RG / AER / ACRO)

CD

The music for each exercise must be sent electronically to k.wilusz@awf.katowice.pl no later than 15.07.2017.

Each music must be sent separately in one file (mp4).

The Head of Delegation must give to WOC 1 copy of Music CD for each routine as per the norms given in the FIG Code of Points. Coaches must have a second copy to be used during training.

The following information must be clearly marked in English on the mp3 file and CDs:

- Federation (Country abbreviation)
- Discipline (RG / AER / ACRO)
- Category (Hoop / MxP / AER STEP)
- Exercise (only for ACRO – B / D / C)
- Exact length of the music (in minutes and seconds) from the first to the last tone of the music

Example: SUI, ACRO, MxP, B, 2'28")

The CDs will be returned to the Heads of Delegation or his/her representative after competition. It is recommended that spare CD be brought for safety reasons.

Note: Coaches / Gymnasts are responsible for bringing their own CD to the training sessions (second copy).

MUSIC FORM

All NF must send to FIG, smartinet@fig-gymnastics.org the Music Form (appendix 2) dully filled in with the correct information, as soon as possible but no later than:

RG / AER – 17.07.2017

ACRO – 21.07.2017

The Music Form must be sent in excel file (pdf will not be accepted).

8. Inquiry

Inquiries for the difficulty scores are allowed, provided that they are made verbally immediately after the publication of the score or at the very latest before the end of the exercise of the following gymnast. The person designated to receive the verbal inquiry has to note the time of receiving it and this starts the procedure.

Only the accredited coaches next to the competition area are entitled to submit an inquiry.

Inquiries for all other marks are not allowed.

Late verbal inquiries will be rejected. A federation is not allowed to complain against a gymnast from another federation.

The inquiry must be confirmed as soon as possible in writing (appendix 1), but within 4 minutes at the latest after the verbal inquiry and requires an agreement of payment of USD 300.-- for the first complaint; USD 500.-- for the second complaint and USD 1'000.-- for the third complaint. Should the inquiry not be confirmed in writing within 4 minutes, the procedure becomes obsolete.

Should the inquiry prove correct and is accepted, this sum will not be invoiced by FIG to the NF. Otherwise, the sum will be invoiced by FIG to the NF will be transferred to the FIG Foundation.

Every inquiry must be examined by the Superior Jury which will take a final decision which may not be appealed.

The detailed procedure is laid down in the FIG Technical Regulation.

See 8.4 in Technical Regulations, Section 1.

9. Medal award ceremony

The medal award ceremonies will take place at the end of each final (please refer to #2 of this Workplan). Only the medal winners are invited to participate. They must wear NF official track suit.

Further information will be given during the Orientation Meetings.

Once medals and mascot have being awarded, the national anthem of the winning country (Gold Medal) will be played for approximately 45 seconds.

10. Communication and Media

Press Conferences

Press Conferences will be decided on site.

All persons requested for a Press Conference, must follow WOC information. An FIG Media Operations Coordinator will be on site during all time – Blythe Lawrence.

Television

The Host Broadcaster - ATM System contracted by WOC and IWGA's production arm ISB - will be in charge of the Polish and international transmission of The World Games 2017. They will

prepare a global transmission plan, which will include the order of emission for the individual disciplines of TWG 2017.

The international television package will be composed of, among other things, the transmission of the sport competitions, special events and daily highlights of TWG 2017. The latest status of the international TV and online distribution of TWG 2017 including the list of international TV channels and platforms will be announced on the IWGA website www.theworldgames.org. When in Poland, TWG 2017 transmissions could be watched on Polsat, Polsat Sport and Super Polsat channels. Please bear in mind that there will be a mixed zone on the venue created for the purpose of conducting interviews with the athletes. The mixed zone will be divided into two sections – first one will be staffed with Host Broadcaster's and TV Rights Holders TV crews. In the second one all the media not having the rights to broadcast TWG 2017 will be located. Athletes are kindly asked to serve both sections, but the priority is given at all times to Host Broadcaster and TV Rights Holders.

11. Opening and closing ceremony

The official Opening Ceremony of TWG 2017 will take place at Wroclaw Stadium on 20 July 2017 at 19:00

Because of the Opening Ceremony, all activities of the day (trainings, meetings, ...) must be finished by 15:00, at the latest.

The official Closing Ceremony of TWG 2017 will take place at Wolnosci Square on 30 July 2017 at 21:00

12. Athletes' Night

The Athletes' Night will take place at Wolnosci Square – The World Games Plaza - on 26 July 2017.

This is a celebration dedicated to the athletes. The event will feature a concert and will show many spectacular events including a laser-light show.

WOC will not provide special transport.

13. Medical Services & Trainer, FICS Service

Medical, trainer, and FICS (Fédération Internationale de Chiropratique du Sport) services will be performed throughout the competition.

Medical services

There will be multiple health care modules with medical staff and volunteering at every venue.

FICS service

All chiropractic treatments and sports taping will be provided by the FICS under the consent and request from the athlete, the head of delegation or the coach. Any sports injury that requires doctor's prescription or intrusive medical treatment will be referred to the WOC's first aid medical team.

FICS will be performing chiropractic service at specific venues according to the request received from IFs.

FICS service is carried out in conjunction with IFs' current medical protocols. The medical team is responsible for providing medical sundries and other relevant equipment.

FICS service will be in compliance with the local medical law and regulations.

14. Anti-Doping Controls

Authority to test:

Pursuant to the IWGA Anti-Doping Rules, all athletes participating at The World Games may be subject to In-Competition Testing for the duration beginning on the date of the Opening Ceremony for The World Games, namely, 20 July 2017 up until and including the day of the Closing Ceremony of The World Games, namely, 27 July 2017.

The chair of IWGA Medical Committee or his/her representative is responsible to oversee all Anti-Doping Testing during The World Games.

Doping Control Station (DCS)

There will be more than one DCS. All samples of athletes will be collected based on the doping control procedures in accordance with International Standard for Testing, and will be analyzed in a WADA- accredited laboratory.

Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE)

Any participating athlete requiring a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) shall file the application together with medical documents required to IWGA Medical Committee.

Governing Rules

The IWGA Anti-Doping Rules shall be applicable during The World Games, whereas the World Anti-Doping Code shall apply.

Anti-Doping Control Guide for The World Games approved by the IWGA Medical Committee will be available for all participating delegations before their departure to the Games. Test Distribution Planning will be elaborated by the IWGA Medical Committee.

PART III - OPERATIONS

1. Welcome – Official language

The delegations will be welcomed on behalf of the Wroclaw Organising Committee upon arrival in Wroclaw Airport. They will be brought to the Hotels for accreditation.

The official languages are English and Polish. Interpretation from and into other languages must be organised by the delegations. All documents will be in English.

2. Arrival / Departure – Local Transportation

All participants who arrive to Wroclaw Airport will be welcomed at the Information Desk in the arrivals hall and directed to proper busses departing to their accommodation places. Dedicated buses will be properly signed.

TWG buses will be parked in the front of the Terminal, on the third lane.

All the departure details will be available in the accommodation centre on the information boards. The bus lines marked with the airport sign will take you on your departure day from accommodation place to Wroclaw Airport.

3. Health Insurance

During the Games the valid health insurance is mandatory. Without any personal insurance, there will be the possibility to buy on site. Estimated cost per day: 14 USD.

4. Accreditation

All the participants will be accredited upon their arrival at their accommodation place. The accreditation card is personal, non-transferable and compulsory to gain access to the opening/closing ceremony, the training and competition venues, Catering Centre as well as the WOC's official transportation system for Athletes and Officials. The accreditation card identifies individuals participating in The World Games 2017 and indicates their access rights to the different zones listed in the Accreditation Badge. Access control will be conducted at the entrance to restricted areas and while entering official buses. The Accreditation Badge allows free entrance to each competition venue on the athletes' stand but please note that venue capacities are limited, so there are no reservations on the athletes' stands available.

All participants are required to wear the Accreditation Badge at any time in the official zones.

5. Information desk

Information can be obtained at the information desk which is located in the Centennial Hall.

6. Mail Boxes

The mail boxes will be located in the Centennial Hall.

7. Accommodation and Meals

Accommodation:

The hotel only covers the night of stay and breakfast for the next morning on the service dates. Other expenses, such as telephone bill, paid TV, mini-bar and laundry, are not covered by WOC and individuals shall be responsible for these expenses.

- RG: 17th / 18th July until 23rd July = 6 / 5 nights
- AER: 18th / 19th July until 23rd July = 5 / 4 nights
- TRA: 21st / 22nd July until 27th July = 6 / 5 nights
- ACRO: 21st / 22nd July until 27th July = 6 / 5 nights

For hotel distribution, please refer to Appendix 5 of this Workplan.

Meals

Breakfast served at the hotels.

- Breakfast 06:30 – 10:00

Lunch and dinner will be served in the catering center located in 1 IASE Hall, 1 Wystawowa Street (ul. Wystawowa 1), 51-618 Wrocław (5 minutes walking distance from Centennial Hall).

- Lunch 12:00 -16:00

Main course served at the counter, selection of three types of meals available: meat, fish and vegetarian. Side dishes: soups, salads, fruits, vegetables, etc. served in buffet style.

- Dinner 18:00 - 22:00

Main course served at the counter, selection of three types of meals available: meat, fish and vegetarian. Side dishes: soups, salads, fruits, vegetables, etc. served in buffet style.

Accreditation card will be required for access to catering center.

8. Seating for the delegations

Reserved seating will be allocated to Delegations. These seats will be available on a first come, first served basis. Delegates will be requested not to sit in any other spectator seats within the arena

9. Ticketing

Tickets for The World Games 2017 can be obtained over the Internet, by visiting: www.ebilet.pl as well as at various ticket sale points around Poland - a full list is available at: www.ebilet.pl Ticket prices vary from 5 to 60 Polish Zloty (PLN) - 1 euro = appr. 4,25 PLN.

Single-entrance, discounted tickets can be purchased for half the price of normal tickets and family tickets are also available for those with at least three children (in which case one child gains entrance completely free). All students (full- or part-time, regardless of age) as well as retirees over age 60 may purchase discounted tickets and they are also available to handicapped fans. In the case of those who are wheelchair-bound, their helpers pay only 1 PLN. Fans of sport disciplines whose competitions last more than two days may also be interested in special ticket packages. One option includes a special half-day pass (for one morning or one afternoon session) for enthusiasts of beach handball, American football (one session equals one match), bowling, finswimming, lifesaving, floorball, ultimate frisbee, karate, kick-boxing, roller-skating,

sport climbing and tug-of-war. During The Games the selling points will be also located at the sports venues, TWG Plaza and Municipality Stadium (in the Opening Ceremony's day).

Wroclaw: 293 km² (Poland's 4th largest city)

- Lower Silesia: 19,947 km²
- Wroclaw: 640,000 + 150,000 students
- Wroclaw Agglomeration: approx. 1 million people
- Lower Silesia: approx. 3 million people

Wroclaw attracts tourists like a magnet with its location, mild climate, interesting historical sites and hospitable citizens. It lies in the middle of the Silesian Lowlands, where the Odra River branches out to form 12 islands of varying size. As the largest city of Lower Silesia, Wroclaw is the region's administrative, economic and cultural capital.

Standing on twelve islands on the Oder river and its four tributaries, it is often called the Venice of the North. It is a city with a thousand years of history: it passed from the hands of Czech kings under the rule of Austria, and then Prussia; finally, after the Second World War, it became a part of Poland. Today, the heritage of the past intertwines with modernity.

As a city open to new ideas and challenges, Wroclaw has gained a reputation as dynamic and innovative. It boasts a broad cultural and entertainment offer, and it is considered to be one of the most business-friendly cities to boot. Its atmosphere attracts people from all around the country and the world. It is the visitors who say Wroclaw is the place that must be seen first and foremost when coming to Poland. The most interesting historical buildings, artwork and museums can be found in the Old Town and its environs.

They can be visited on foot, and many hotels and most restaurants and shops are within walking distance of the Old Town as well. Wroclaw is an extensive city, so you should buy a city map or use a PTTK guide; please inquire at the Tourist Information Centre at 14 Market Square (Rynek 14). Cruises on the Odra River, with a great panoramic view of the city along Ostrow Tumski, are organized in summer. You can also enjoy a ride on the historical Hansel & Gretel tramway and on the open top bus, Fredruś.

12. Specific Information

12.1 RHYTHMIC GYMNASTICS

CONTROL OF APPARATUS AND LEOTARDS

During the training sessions, each gymnast will have the opportunity to have her apparatus verified and to have the official control label attached to it.

During the competition, the checking procedure may take place before each exercise. A further check may take place at the end of the exercise at the request of the Superior Jury.

Any apparatus which does not conform to the regulations will be refused the authorisation or its use penalized, even if it has already been accepted at another competition.

12.2 TRAMPOLINE GYMNASTICS

COMPETITION CARDS

Head of Delegation must give to the Secretariat (Centennial Hall) 1 copy of each Competition Card Qualifications and Final. (appendix 3)

12.3 ACROBATIC GYMNASTICS

TARIFF SHEETS

Head of Delegation must give to the Secretariat (Centennial Hall) 1 copy of each Tariff Sheet - Qualifications and Finals. (appendix 4)

The Tariff sheet for Finals can be changed until 1 h after the end of the qualifications

ATHLETE'S MEASUREMENTS (ACRO)

The athlete measurement will take place between 14:00 and 19:00 on July 28th following the second training session of each delegation.

Measurements will take place in Centennial Hall.

ATHLETES' REPRESENTATIVE ELECTION (ACRO)

The election of the ACRO Athlete representative for the 2017 – 2020 cycle will take place on 23 July 2017 at 15:00.
